- ◆ Special exhibits of Hayes memorabilia.
- ◆ Special hooked rug display & live demonstrations by the "Chillicothe Ruggers" showing how hooked rugs are made.
- ◆ Exhibits of 19th century home furnishings & decorative arts.

- ◆ Grand Opening of the new Camp Sherman & World War I exhibit.

- ◆ Special exhibit of famous Ross Countians.
- ◆ All permanent exhibits will also be open as well.

- ◆ The historic home (built 1806-07) and grounds of Thomas Worthington — Ohio's first U.S. senator, sixth governor, and "Father of Ohio Statehood."
- ◆ The inspiration for the Great Seal of Ohio, & Tecumseh's tomahawk.
- ◆ Guided tours of the Adena Mansion.
- ◆ Worthington & Early Statehood Museum.
- ◆ Scenic grounds, with a great view of Chillicothe.
